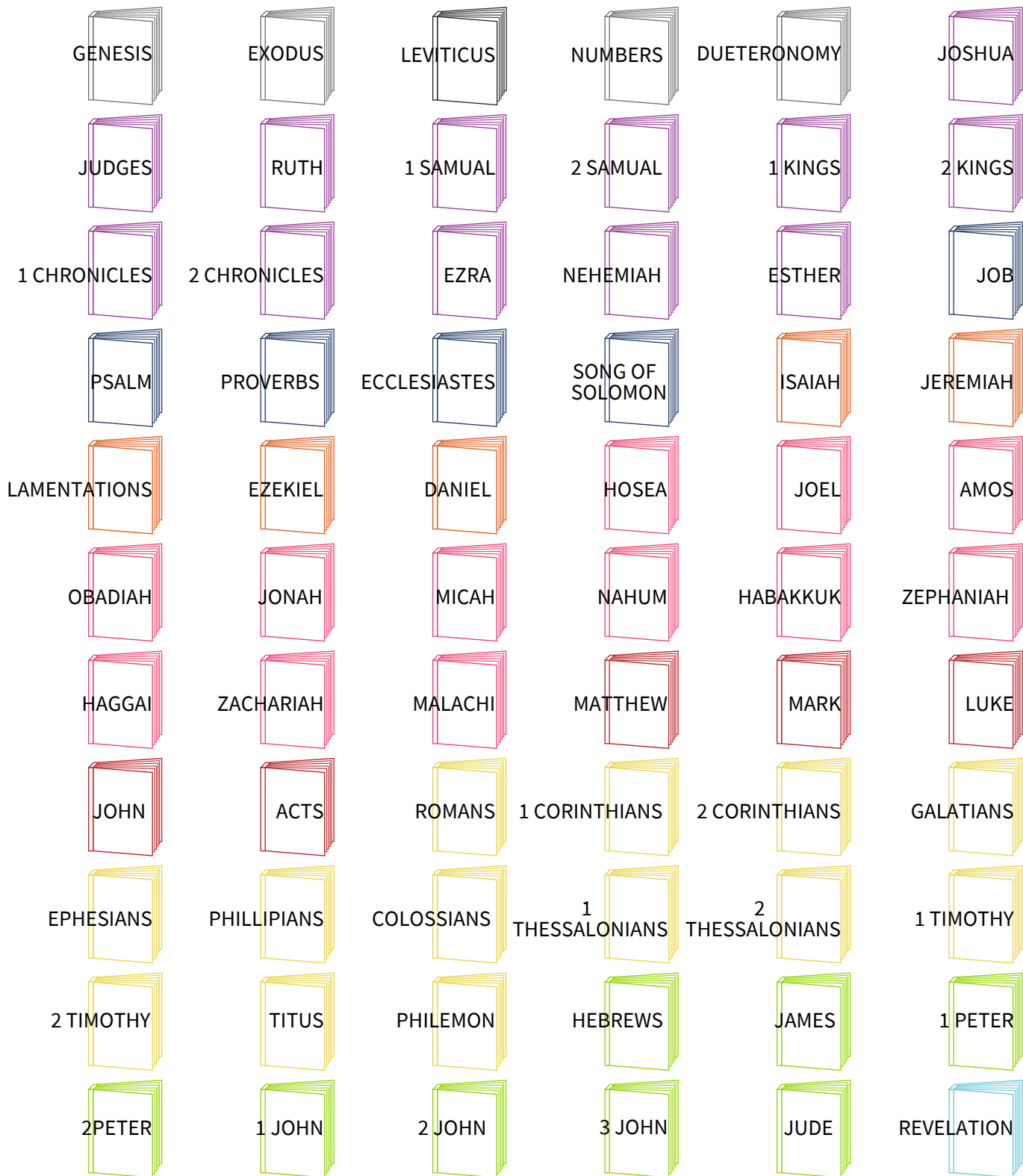


# 66 BOOKS OF THE BIBLE CHALLENGE

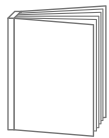


## READING RESOURCE

If you desire to read the entire Bible, cross off each book of the Bible as you complete it. There are many ways to read through the book. Some people read the Bible cover-to-covers, other's read it chronologically, still other's start with the Gospels and then go back to the Old Testament. There's nothing wrong with bouncing around from one book to another. Whatever approach you take, use this resource to cross off each book as you finish. It's color coded for easy references of how each book is cauterized since the Bible is organized by those categories.

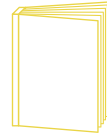
### LAW

The first five books (Pentateuch) of the Hebrew Bible, also known as the Torah (which means teaching), were written by Moses.



### MAJOR PROPHET

Written by individuals proclaiming events to come, including the coming of Christ.



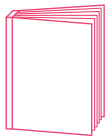
### PAULINE EPISTLES

Letters written by the Apostle Paul to various churches around the region.



### HISTORY

Tells the history of God's people, the Isrealites. These books demonstrate so clearly our inability to live our lives free from God's love and control.



### MINOR PROPHET

Also written by individuals exclaiming events to come, these prophetic books are shorter in length and narrower in proclamation.



### GENERAL EPISTLES

Additional letters written to churches or people about the teachings of Christ.



### POETIC

Poems written mainly by King David and His son Solomon. These works portray human suffering and our desperate need for God's enduring love.



### GOSPEL & ACTS

These four books were written about the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. Acts then portrays the works of the Holy Spirit.



### APOCALYPTIC

Declaring the end of time as we understand it because Jesus returns to overcome sin and death.
